Let's discover Dutch in the Netherlands at the museum!

1. Dictionary

Illustrated, and with all the useful vocabulary for this module.

2. Memory game


Mix the 16 blue cards with the artworks and put them face down on the table. Each player turns two cards over to try and find a pair. The player with the most pairs at the end of the game wins!



3. Word association game


Mix the 16 blue cards with the artworks and put them in a pile. Put the 16 red cards with Dutch words face up on the table. One artwork is revealed. The first player to think of an association grabs the cards and explains his reasoning. If no player finds an association, the next artwork is revealed. The player with the most pairs at the end of the game wins!

For instance: If the artwork is a 17th-century painting with one boy, a player could grab any of these cards: Jongen (boy), Een (1), Oud (old) or even Zwart (the boy wears a black outfit). There are consistently several possible associations.



4. Artists game

Easy mode: All the purple artwork title cards are face up on the table. One of the 8 blue art card is revealed, and the first person to put their finger on the right title card wins the pair. The player with the most pairs at the end of the game wins!



Memory mode: Mix 8 cards with the artworks with the 8 cards with the names of the paintings and put them face down on the table. Each player turns over two cards to try to find a pair. The player with the most pairs at the end of the game wins!



5. Pictionary

One player picks a red card and draws the concept that is written on it. He cannot write letters or numbers. The other players try to guess what he is drawing. The first player to find the word in Dutch wins a point, as well as the artist. At the end, the player with the most points wins.

6. “In het museum” drawing

This drawing combines all the artworks of the cards. Can you find them all and use them as inspiration to colour it in?

7. Comics reading comprehension

Use it to practice reading comprehension, to read aloud to practice pronunciation and interactions, or as a base for a short role play!



8. Timeline

This game needs a gamemaster who will check each answer with the timeline below and two players.

Mix the 8 cards with the artworks and put them face down on the table.

A first card is put face up on the table. The first player picks a card, and puts it before or after card on the table, depending on how old it is. The gamemaster checks the answer. If the card was in its right place, the player wins a point. If not, the card is put at the right place and he does not win a point.

Each player turns one card over and places it at the right place. The player with the most points at the end of the game wins.
